Bipartisan Infrastructure Law

~50% increase in funding





Bipartisan Infrastructure Law

USDOT will leverage funding & policies in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to bring strategy to life:

- Nearly \$14 billion in NEW funding for road safety including:
 - \$6 billion authorized for a new Safe Streets and Roads for All program to fund local efforts to reduce crashes and fatalities – review Action Plan recipients
 - ~ \$4 billion added to Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP)
 - ~ **\$4 billion** for improved data collection, vehicle safety programs, and truck safety

In the Senate of the United States,

August 10, 2021.

Resolved, That the bill from the House of Representatives (II.R. 3684) entitled "An Act to authorize funds for Federal-aid highways, highway safety programs, and transit programs, and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

AMENDMENT:

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

2 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the "In-

3 frastructure Investment and Jobs Act".

4 (b) TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The table of contents for

5 this Act is as follows:

Sec. 1. Short title; table of contents. Sec. 2. References.

DIVISION A-SURFACE TRANSPORTATION

Sec. 10001. Short title. Sec. 10002. Definitions. Sec. 10003. Effective date.



U.S. Fire Administration and NHTSA Office of EMS partner to study roadside "struck-by" incidents to emergency responders

The interagency agreement will address this significant but poorly understood risk to public safety and identify practices to improve responder safety.



Highway Safety Grant Funding Deadlines

• Deadline: July 1, 2023

- 2024 2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plans due (new)
- Requires descriptions of "countermeasure strategies" supported by "problem identification" & "justification [of] effectiveness"

Deadline: August 1, 2023

- 2024 Annual Highway Safety Plans due
- Includes adjustments to Triennial Plan & countermeasure strategies
- Programmatic grant application to NHTSA for efforts under:
 - Section 402 State & Community Highway Safety Grant Program
 - Section 405(c) State Traffic Safety Information System Improvement
 - Section 405(h) Preventing Roadside Deaths (new)

WHAT IS TIM? TIM is about coordinated efforts to detect, respond to, and clear traffic incidents safely and quickly.

TIM is an evidence based, low-cost solution 30% fewer secondary crashes involving responders through TIM

30% - 35% lower incident clearance time through TIM

TIM Strategies Save Lives, Time, and Money

- State or regional multidisciplinary coalitions or committees.
- National TIM Responder Training.
- Policy, legislation, and enforcement.
- Performance and technology-based operations.



Renewed Focus on Safety

National Roadway Safety Strategy (NRSS)

- Adopts Safe System Approach principles, including five implementation objectives, one of which is post-crash care.
- Specifically lists TIM as an action to support NRSS objectives.
 - Develop and implement outreach plan for emergency medical services (EMS) personnel for on-scene safety and traffic incident training.
 - Advance TIM training and technologies targeted at improved responder (including EMS) and motorist safety.



National Roadway Safety Strategy Objectives FHWA

TIM EMS Outreach Plan

- Developed by FHWA with input from NEMSMA, NASEMSO, and NHTSA
- Goal is to promote safe traffic incident response practices among EMS personnel.

Objectives:

- 1. Increase the number of State EMS Offices that engage with counterpart state TIM Committees.
- 2. Make EMS personnel aware of TIM, the National TIM Responder Training course, and that it qualifies for continuing education credits.
- 3. Increase the number of EMS training entities that offer/incorporate the National TIM Responder training for initial training and continuing education credit.

*NEMSMA is the National EMS Management Association and NASEMSO is the National Association of State EMS Officials.

Institutionalizing the National TIM Responder Training WHAT and WHY



National TIM Responder Training

- Developed by responders for responders for ALL aspects of TIM and responder safety.
- TIM Training Goals:
 - Train 1M Responders
 - Institutionalize training
- Multiple free and accessible training options.
- KY and GA require TIM Responder Training as a part of Paramedic/EMS licensing.

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

Continuing Education Credits for TIM Training


 Licensed firefighter, paramedic or emergency medical technicians can receive continuing education units (CEUs*) towards certification or recertification for the 4-hour web-based National TIM Training (NHI course 133126A)

Approximately 125 law enforcement, fire, and EMS training academies have TIM training curriculum




Many agencies have laws, administrative rules, or policies requiring National TIM Responder Training.

After training all personnel in TIM, the Houston Fire Department experienced a 40% reduction in on-scene time for motor vehicle incidents.
